

Father Edward's Notebook

Dear Parishioners,

This week I continue the bulletin column series on teaching about the Mass. We are still in the stages before the Mass begins. Last week I wrote about the importance of Sunday Mass and also our preparation during the week for the Lord's Day or the sabbath.

Once we arrive at Church, in pre-covid times, we would dip our hands in a holy water font and bless ourselves. This gesture was done to recall our baptism, and also serves as a blessing for ourselves. Holy water is a powerful sacramental when used by the Faithful. Some people occasionally bless their houses with holy water. I went to school at a Benedictine monastery in Conception, Missouri. Each night as the monks gather for night prayer, after singing a hymn to the Blessed Virgin, each monk approaches the Abbot, the leader of the monastic community, and he sprinkles them with holy water. Holy Water has been known to be a tool in combating evil. If you have a holy water bottle, feel free to fill it up at the church, keep it in your purse, and bless yourself and your family as you come to church.

Once we enter into the church, you find your pew, and probably you have been sitting in that same pew for years! We are creatures of habit. Before entering the pew, you genuflect, or if you are unable to bend your knee (the literal meaning of the word genuflect), you would bow as a sign of reverence. This is done because Jesus is present before us in the tabernacle (indicated by the red sanctuary lamp). Also in the scriptures it says that at the name of Jesus every knee shall bow. When one approaches a king or queen, you would genuflect, and so as we approach the King of Kings, Jesus himself, we offer him all our praise and worship both by word and gesture.

Finally, people spend a few moments in quiet prayer before moving on to reading the bulletin or the readings for the Mass. During that prayer, maybe you pray in thanksgiving or bring your intentions in prayer. Often, the rosary might be recited before Mass, which is a nice way for us to continue a spirit of prayer in anticipation of Mass beginning.

Next week, I'll share more about the introductory rites of Mass.
