Dear Parishioners,

[August 4th](#) is the feast day of St. John Vianney. He is known as the patron saint of priests. He lived in France and was the priest in a small village of Ars. He nearly wasn't ordained because he was not the brightest student and was assigned to Ars because they thought he would do the least amount of damage in a small village. He became a heroic priest. Upon his arrival to town, he met a young person and he asked for directions to the local church. He then told the young man that he would lead him to heaven. St. John Vianney was a very simple man. His daily meal was meager- a baked potato. Hearing confessions was one of the most important aspects of his ministry as he would sit in the confessional for 10-12 hours a day. St. John Vianney was a holy priest held up as a standard for all priests.

I think of the different priests who have had an influence and impact on my life. Of course, I think of the priest who baptized me. Then my mind turns to the priests who pastored the parish where I grew up. I also had several retired priests who had a major impact on my life. I think of them often and give thanks to God for their vocation. As a priest now, surrounded by brother priests both in the Diocese but also in my work that I do outside of the diocese, I have met many good and holy priests who inspire me.

As we remember St. John Vianney this week, I'd invite you to think of the priests who have impacted you. And as you do so, give thanks to God for their calling. If you want to pray for priests in a special way, I'd encourage you to Google, "Prayer for priests" and you will find several.

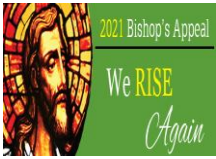
