

Father Edward's Notebook

Dear Parishioners,

For many of you who follow me on social media, you are aware of many of my adventures. I also realize that some don't have social media and so they miss it. I'd like to share about a few happenings over the last month or so that you might be interested in.

In August, I made a quick day trip to Chicago to do an episode of a History Channel show called "The Unexplained" which is hosted by William Shatner. I didn't meet him. The show will be about visions of the future and had a specific emphasis on Fatima and the secrets the visionaries received. The show, I'm told, will air sometime in the first quarter of next year.

On September 14th, I delivered a talk to a Legatus chapter in Baltimore. One of the members of the organization has apparently been a follower of my writings and podcast and had them invite me to speak. I shared about three of my holy heroes, Solanus Casey, Fr. Daniel Lord, and Adele Brise, as a way to share how they loved Mary and highlight the premise of my latest book *How They Love Mary: 28 Life-changing Stories of Devotion to Mary*.

I arrived early enough for the talk and departed late enough the next day that I was able to see some sights. I drove two hours each way to Philadelphia and back to visit someone I met while in Spain in April and also to pray at the National Shrine of St. John Neumann. St. John Neumann was an immigrant to the US. There were to many priests in Europe that he decided to come to America and then found a diocese to be ordained for service as a priest. He later joined the Redemptorist religious order and was named bishop of Philadelphia. His story was incredible and I look forward to reading his biography soon. I also had the chance to visit the National Shrine of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton in Emmitsburg, a saint I didn't know much about. Nearby was the National Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes and 15mins away was Gettysburg, which I made a quick stop at so say I was there.

I've made a decision to cancel the 10:15 Mass in Lincoln on October 9th. I'm moving the Mass time to 7am which means there will be no confessions in Brussels at 8am. Mass in Brussels will remain at 8:30am on the 9th of October.
