

# Father Edward's Notebook

Dear Parishioners,

This past week I recorded and released a YouTube video about the use of sick call sets. Knowing that not everyone has the means to find YouTube videos or see them linked on Facebook, I thought it appropriate to share the teaching in this column too.

There are two varieties of sick call sets. I have seen one more than the other, but the second is really popular in our area, in fact the first place I encountered one with the pieta of Mary holding the body of Jesus was in the homes and roadside chapels surrounding our parish. The one I had greater familiarity with was in the form of a crucifix. The top half of the crucifix slides off and then there is a slot to put the crucifix in so it stands up. In the secret hideaway are two candles and a little bottle of holy water. You can set up the candles and light them. The other version common in this area is a large shadow box with a Michaelangelo style pieta image. There is a storage compartment that has an image of the Last Supper, which I wasn't aware of until I moved it one day. In that compartment is a crucifix, candles, a paten, and oddly enough a spoon.

The idea with these sick call sets is that you would set them up when a priest would visit to administer the sacraments, specifically anointing of the sick and holy communion. They are not necessary, but they are a nice devotional practice. Often people will have them on the wall in their bedroom, thinking that if one was very sick, they would be confined to bed.

This is a good reminder to let people know to ask to have your loved ones anointed as they begin to decline and not to wait until the last minute, just in case I'm not available or another priest cannot be found. Only a priest can anoint; a deacon cannot. Part of the "Last Rites" includes anointing of the sick and a few additional prayers. One of those prayers is highly indulgenced called the Apostolic Pardon. Typically, a person close to death cannot make a confession, but the forgiveness of sins is administered with the Apostolic Pardon. And finally, there is a beautiful prayer that says, "Go forth Christian soul from this world..." and is a prayer of commending the dying soul to God.

Jesus commended his soul to the Father from the Cross. St. Stephen did the same as he was stoned to death. This is a venerable tradition of the Church, which is efficacious for the soul of the dying and brings comfort to their family at the hour of death. If you know of someone who needs to be anointed, please let me know.
