

Father Edward's Notebook

Dear Parishioners,

Last weekend in the parish we crowned the statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This traditional May Crowning has been done for many years. A popular song that would be sung during the crowning was "Bring Flowers of the Fairest, Bring Flowers of the Rarest." The flowers become a token of our appreciation for our heavenly mother and her role in salvation history. St. Louis de Montfort piously believed that each Hail Mary of the rosary represented a rose and as we prayed it, the rosary allowed a bouquet of flowers to be presented to Mary in Heaven.

Another tradition regarding Mary and flowers is that of the Mary garden. This pious devotion of having a statue of Mary in your garden and planting flowers around her is also quite old. Many flowers have a Marian attribute. The most common flower, roses, is associated with a verse from the Song of Songs in the Old Testament that Mary is the Rose of Sharon. In Lourdes, she appeared with gold roses on her feet and Juan Diego in Mexico was to collect roses and bring them to the bishop. Another oral legend said that Mary's tomb (believing she was in the tomb before her Assumption) was filled with lilies. The name Marigold was formed from the words "Mary's Gold" and were a common flower presented to statues of Mary. The violets symbolize Mary's modesty. A legend surrounding thistle calls it Our Lady's thistle because drops of her milk caused the spotting. Strawberries were a reminder of Mary's fruitfulness in her virginity. There are many other flowers too, simply search online for "Mary's Flower garden" and something will certainly pop up.

Speaking of flowers and mothers, roses are on sale this weekend as a quick gift for the mother(s) in your life. Proceeds of the sale will benefit the pro-life cause.

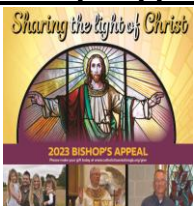
