

Father Edward's Notebook

Dear Parishioners,

I cannot believe that May is more than half over. I honestly don't know where the time goes. I always look forward to the month of May because it means that I have the opportunity to attend the Mariological Society of America meeting. I've been a member of the society since 2011 and have attended eight in-person meetings, this year will be nine, and because of Covid, I also attended two virtual meetings.

The Mariological Society of America is an academic society that promotes study of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It was founded 74 years ago, and at present I serve as the president of the society. There are over 200 members from around the world. About 30 of us will gather in Birmingham, Alabama to share scholarship, foster community, and pray together. I will be giving a paper at the meeting on the title Mary, Help of Christians. Our focus for the annual meeting is a special collection of Marian Masses and theologically analyzing the Mass texts and devotion. Some of the members also asked me if I would share my roadside chapel documentary at the event. The documentary is now available on YouTube, just search "Faith Along the Road."

Of Mariological interest to our Belgian community, is the title Mary, Mediatrix of Grace. A scholar I know will present a paper of Mediation of Grace at our meeting. The promotion of this title and theology of Mary originated in Belgium by Cardinal Mercier. Petitions to the Holy Father were sent asking for the feast and doctrine to be defined. A Mass honoring Our Lady under this title was promulgated. When we ask Mary's intercession, she obtains grace for us from God. One of the principal graces she obtained for us by her yes to the angel was the grace of salvation of redemption.

Since I'll be away Tuesday-Friday, there are no scheduled daily Masses on those days.

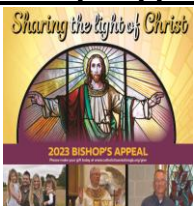
