

Bulletin Reflection

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

“What’s in a name? That which we call a rose by any other name would smell as sweet;” A popular line from William Shakespeare’s play *Romeo & Juliet*. The reference is used to state that the names of things do not affect what they really are. In our Gospel this weekend we are reminded of the sweet name of Jesus and what the reality of that name truly indicates. Jesus asks St. Peter, “Who do you say that I am?” of the various things St. Peter got wrong, or wasn’t very clear on or sure of, this question he couldn’t have answered more perfectly, “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.”

The two questions asked by Jesus are good questions for each of us to ponder and reflect upon. Of the first question, “Who do people say that the son of man is?”, we can look to our religious education or our faith formation. We are taught about Jesus, the good works he did during his time on this earth. We learned that he is the Son of God and was with God from the beginning of time. We grapple with the mystery of Jesus as one part of the Holy Trinity as well as the Mystery of Jesus being truly present in the Eucharist. There are many doctrines and dogmas of the church regarding Jesus that we can read about and learn about, and through faith come to accept. This can help answer the question of who *people* say that Jesus is.

The second and more important question is, “who do you say that Jesus is?” This speaks to our relationship with Jesus. The first question is about head knowledge; the second one is about heart knowledge. Are we able to answer that second question with boldness and confidence like Peter did? When he answered, “you are the Christ”, it was in a way, a profession of faith for Peter. The word “Christ” is more of a title than it is a name. It means the anointed one or the chosen one, the Messiah. Do we accept Jesus as the Christ, as our Messiah, our personal Savior? As we contemplate these questions and the sweet name of Jesus and his title, perhaps we can look at our own names, not just our given names, but our title of “Christian”. If the strangers in our midst were asked who we are, would they be able to answer “Christian”? Let us live our lives as Christ taught so all may know we are Christians by our love!

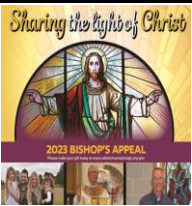
