

From Deacon's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This weekend marks the end of ordinary time and the end of our liturgical year. So, in a way it's like the church's New Years Eve! Just as our secular end of year events often include a look back at the year gone by, perhaps we should take a look back at our church year and our spiritual year. Have we grown in our faith? Have we enhanced our relationship with Jesus? Have we lived our lives this past year in a way consistent with the commandments? Have we practiced the corporal works of mercy as mentioned in the Gospel today?

As we reflect on the past year we can also look to the new liturgical year and set some goals for ourselves. With our secular New Year goals, the experts say the most effective goals are the ones that have a specific and tangible objective. We should look at our spiritual goals the same way.

Here are some possible goals to consider:

* Spend more time in prayer. To make this goal tangible, perhaps we need to get specific and intentional. Set aside a certain time each day and a set duration. It may be helpful to set an alarm and use a timer.

* Practice some of the corporal works of mercy. Feed the hungry, cloth the naked, visit the prisoner. Maybe consider volunteering once a month at [Paul's Pantry](#), or [Feed and Clothe My People](#). Perhaps you can look into how you can get involved in prison ministry.

* Share your faith. Perhaps you can make a commitment to talk with your kids every day or even once a week about your faith. An easy way to do this is to ask them where they have seen Jesus and share with them where you have seen Jesus. This can be anything from seeing something beautiful in nature, witnessing an act of kindness, or a good feeling in prayer or at Mass.

Our New Years celebrations bring us to look at the year ahead with hope. Our liturgical new year starts next week with Advent and then moves into Christmas and the Christmas season. This time of year brings great joy and hope to our spirits and souls, our families, and loved ones. Have a Happy New Year!!
