On this Twenty First Sunday in Ordinary Time, we are directed to a kind of discernment to make in our lives. In the first reading, Joshua addressed all the people: "If it does not please you to serve the LORD, decide today whom you will serve, the gods your fathers served beyond the River or the gods of the Amorites in whose country you are now dwelling." With conviction he publicly made known his commitment as he said, "As for me and my household, we will serve the LORD" (Jos 24:1-2a, 15-17, 18b).

Serving the Lord with gladness, especially when we share our time, talents and treasures, is a concrete manifestation of our love for God. To serve God does not only mean performing good works but it has to do with a lifetime commitment with God. Like Joshua, he did not only commit himself alone to serve God, but he enjoined his children and his children's children. Therefore, that is how we must serve the Lord, that is, to serve Him for a lifetime with love for he is our God. When we present ourselves for the service of God and of His Church, we are also becoming closer and closer into His presence and there we can experience, as the responsorial Psalm would tell us, to always taste and see the goodness of the Lord. (Ps 34:2-3, 16-17, 18-19, 20-21).

In the second reading, St. Paul in his Letter to the Ephesians exhorts us to be submissive to one's will as another form of obedience. Being obedient nurtures love and humble service. "Wives should be subordinate to their husbands as to the Lord. For the husband is head of his wife just as Christ is head of the Church... As the Church is subordinate to Christ, so wives should be subordinate to their husbands in everything. Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ loved the Church" (Eph 5:21-32 or 5:2a, 25-32).

May this be a constant reminder to all husbands and wives. A submissive wife gives delight to her husband and a humble husband brings joy to his wife. Thus, the success in marriage may also depend on how the husband and wife humbly submit themselves to one another and learn the virtue of being obedient to the will of God. And ultimately, as the Gospel of John presents to us how Jesus confronted his disciples because of their lack of faith and as a result they returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied Him. On the other hand, Jesus asked the twelve "Do you also want to leave"? So, Peter, with conviction, firmly expressed his willingness to remain with Jesus and said, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God" (Jn 6:60-69). To remain faithful to Christ is one of the highest form service with love. No matter how despairing and disappointing our life would be but if we remain in Him, we are assured of his eternal life.

Like Peter, may we always be ready to stand with strong conviction in witnessing to the truth about Jesus and in professing our faith in God.
